UK PREMIERE



Dir. Elizabeth Chai Vasarhelyi US 2008 Partially subtitled 1hr 42mins Friday 24 April 7.00pm

Combining vibrant concert footage with an insight into Senegal's sacred Muslim rituals, I Bring What I Love follows a warm, inspirational figure in Ndour. Youssou continues a griot storytelling tradition passed on by his grandmother, and comes to focus on his decision to compose Egypt, a deeply spiritual album as an expression of his Islamic faith. This brave musical message was embraced by Western audiences but initially ignited controversy in his homeland.



An album film structured around the tracks of No Fun by Slovenian punk band Pankrti. Starting with the first punk show behind the iron curtain, the film shows how Pankrti instigated social change in former Yugoslavia and draws parallels with such movements in the west.

Despite talent from an early age he could not initially support himself as a musician, until discovered by musicologist John Work III. Waters became an international icon though it seemed the only people who truly benefited were the white singers performing 'cover versions'.
